This Summer Newsletter will bring you up to date with Association events and activity from February this year since the release of the Spring Newsletter. On Thu 4 Apr the RAC were 80 years old with HQ RAC and Regiments of the Corps commemorating this event with an open day at the Tank Museum in Bovington Camp. We had a strong Light Dragoon and antecedent Regiment turnout. All RAC Regiments played their part that day by profiling the Corps throughout UK. The serving Regiment did their bit with jackal vehicles and crews displaying themselves at the likes of the Barnsley Town Hall, the Angel of the North, Alnwick Castle and other locations within our recruiting areas. On the day there were soldiers and vehicles of LD and QOY on display at the Discovery Museum in Newcastle where visitors were able to interact with some of our Association members and serving soldiers of the Regiment in the CHARGE! Gallery of our museum.

Sat 27 Apr saw two Association events take place on the same day, the North West Branch held their annual dinner in the Suites Hotel, Liverpool with 128 attending this included the Colonel of the Regiment and his wife, and on the same evening the East Riding held an event organised by Doug Oliver with this venue again proving popular with members and getting stronger each year held in Hull.

The 2019 Army v Rugby fixture held at Twickenham Sat 4 May proved a hit once again with the Association, we requested and were supplied with 106 tickets and wrist bands, these were bid for from the RAC Pool of allocated tickets, believe it or not we actually take one fifth of the RAC allocation such is the interest from LD personnel, it goes without saying we are strong on the ground at this event.

May saw another good turnout at the Cavalry Memorial service in Hyde Park where we were one of the strongest formed bodies on parade, on completing the service it was a trip to the Paxton's Head in Knightsbridge to continue the afternoon.

On 20th May I travelled to Le Plessis Grimoult a small village near Mont Pincon in France which is a dominating piece of high ground that 13/18H secured in the area of the Falaise Gap during WW2. Travelling with OC B Sqn (Maj Ed Quicke) and the RSM (WO1 Bobbie Buchan) we reced the upcoming Mont Pincon memorial service which we see as part of the D-Day 75 Commemorations, our service will take place Wed 7 August at the feature when we join the local community of the village in a service followed by reception in the village hall for those attending.

This year saw D-Day 75 as a national commemoration day held on Thu 6 Jun. The CHARGE! Gallery team from the Discovery museum which consisted of Mr David Weatherstone as our outreach lead member on the project and his team of Mr Alan Gibson, Peter Bates and Steve Brotherton, all volunteers, who gave the public an insight into the 13/18H explaining how they were involved at Dunkirk, their return to UK and then preparation for the D-Day landings through to the actual assault in Normandy, explaining the Sherman main battle tank and the Duplex Drive means of propulsion in water, plus the swimming screens fitted to the vehicles and many other interesting facts. This proved to be a very popular briefing, with the team complimented afterwards on how they told our story.

On the same day Thu 6 Jun we saw the annual Founders Day service held at the Royal Hospital (RH) Chelsea where our In-Pensioners (IP's) paraded in front of Prince Harry before an afternoon picnic and party in the grounds of the hospital. Of interest, should you ever be in London and wish for a walkabout of the grounds there are organised visits you can join, which if you have never visited before I highly recommend a morning with them. A few days later, Sat 17 Aug will see a service in Lisburn, NI which is being organised by the Northern Ireland Veterans Association (NIVA). A further service organised by NIVA will be held on the main land at the NMA on Sat 14 Sep which the Barnsley Branch often attend and parade with their Association banner, all our members are welcome to join them on the day.

The remainder of the newsletter offers you information relating to the regional dinners in Newcastle on Sat 21 Sep held at the Assembly Rooms in Fenkle Street and Barnsley Sat 5 Oct at the Holiday Inn who will also see their branch golf day held at Silkstone Golf Club the day before Fri 4 Oct for any Association members wishing to play.

The Association will have a small contingent at this year's Cenotaph Service of Remembrance in London on Sun 10 Nov for those who have requested to attend. More information will follow once released by TRBL. Our regional recruiting area parades will take place as normal.

To reassure some of our members Sahagun Day this year will take place on Sat 21 Dec not 20 Dec as previously stated, this after much discussion by the North East Branch, more details and venue to be confirmed soon.

News from the Regiment

The first half of 2019 has seen the Light Dragoons spread across the world, from California to Kenya. The Regiment has conducted numerous exercises and activities, all of which have challenged and intrigued our soldiers but have been met with that happy charm that is imbued in our regimental nature.

The regiment has changed Commanding Officer as Colonel Ben Cossens departs and we welcome back Colonel Tom Robinson. It has also seen the return of Major Dan Lenherr as Regimental Second in Command and Major Luke Dodington as C Squadron Leader. WO1 Buchan has also taken over from Capt Keith Bell as the Regimental Sergeant Major.

B Squadron kick started what will certainly be a typically busy year in our Regiments life with a deployment to Kenya as the Opposing Force for an Infantry Battlegroup. Needless to say they gave their opponents a good run for their money. A Squadron were next into the fray as they took on the same role but supplementing the Queens Dragoon Guards for the next rotation. Both Squadrons thrived in the hot climate and challenging terrain of central Africa and the men and women were given a great opportunity to develop their dismounted skills against a cunning foe. The exercise also provided an excellent opportunity for some world class adventurous training. A team summited Mount Kenya and all enjoyed the fantastic safari trips on offer. Both Squadrons were highly praised by the directing staff for their skills and ingenuity, and rightly so given their unfamiliarity with the operating environment.

C Squadron were not simply left sat on their bergans, California was calling and in March the squadron deployed to the Nevada Desert to complete Exercise DIAMONDBACK. This is a world class exercise comprising of huge numbers of American armour, air assets and an enormous training area. The Squadron re-rolled to Humvee trucks as set to work as a long-range reconnaissance asset for an American Brigade. They spent their time proving to our American friends the art of the possible. Penetrating deep behind their enemies' front lines they focussed their time on building an intelligence picture of the enemy's rear echelon, causing havoc throughout. Often being confused for Special Forces the Americans were deeply impressed with our independent nature and agile approach to war fighting. They came away with a glowing reputation. As with Kenya an excellent Adventurous training package followed, including deep sea fishing and surfing along the coast of California.

With all Squadrons back in the UK a period of training followed, with ranges and exercises around North Yorkshire to lead us up to the summer stand down. The regiment is still held at high levels of readiness, both for UK operations and as part of the Joint Expeditionary Force Light Brigade. This has given time for sport and support to our local area. Soldiers attended an excellent Armed Forces Day celebration hosted by Leeds Rhinos in their stadium as well as attending the Great Yorkshire show. In late July a Light Dragoon team entered the Nijmegen March, a 100-mile, four-day event in Holland which was thoroughly enjoyed, almost all of the time! The most notable successes in the sporting domain have come from the Triathlon team who have found victory in almost every competition they have entered. The sense of fun and a thirst for adventure remains strong throughout those at regimental duty.

As we look forward into the remainder of 2019 we are set for an exciting range package later in the year before we head to Scotland to exercise as a Battlegroup. Building on the skills learnt on Ex WESSEX STORM in the cold weather of Salisbury Plain last year and the newer skills learnt in the heat of the Kenyan Savanna, it should be an excellent run out for the Regiment. Although often spread to the four winds the regiment is thriving in Yorkshire and will certainly continue to flourish in the remainder of this year.

The museum continues to be well visited by the public and Association members alike. The serving Regiment have visited in small squadron and department groups over the period as soldiers are shown their Regimental museum and the history linked to LD. Since February the museum has held several temporary displays in the gallery. First was by the children of Wallbottle School who produced a display based on their version of flags and Guidons as they interpreted them. A variation of colours and flags were produced with their view on what they believed they stood for.

D-Day 75 Commemorations saw the emphasis on the Sherman tanks of 13/18H with their duplex drive and swimming screens, which also had a talk associated to the event on the actual assault day of 6 Jun by the Outreach team and three of our Association volunteer's involved.

After D-Day 75 followed a further temporary display which can still be viewed and is our current display until later this year by the British Limbless Ex Servicemen's Association (BLESMA) the display opened 16 Jul and gives an insight to all the good work this charity provides and how people's lives have been changed as a result. At the end of the year there will be a Northumberland Hussar 200 display which is their opportunity (as part of the Queen's Own Yeomanry) to celebrate the bicentenary of the forming of the Regiment which will take us up to 2020.

SOME USEFUL INFORMATION FOR YOUR NEXT OF KIN

We thought we would let our Members know of the services we provide when one of our Members sadly passes away. We would be grateful if you would make your loved ones aware of the details contained within this article.

When a Member sadly passes away HHQ will send out a letter to your Next of Kin (NOK) passing on our condolences from the Colonel of the Regiment and Association Members. Once we have confirmed funeral details we will send out an email/letter to those Association Members that would have served with the deceased covering their years of service and letting them know of the funeral details. We can provide to the funeral director a Regimental Flag to adorn the coffin, forage cap (ie 13/18H, 15/19H or LD) and we will send a floral wreath in Regimental colours on behalf of the Association if requested. We will also, if the NOK agrees, place a short obituary on the deceased in our annual Journal and we will provide a copy gratis to the NOK when released in May, be aware that the Journal covers obituaries in the calendar year ie Jan–Dec. We will ask the family if they can provide and are happy for us to use a suitable photograph to accompany the obituary.

We strongly recommend that Association Members ensure adequate insurance cover is in place to cover what can be a very expensive outlay for your NOK.

If you are in receipt of a service pension then you should also pass on the details of the phone number of the Veterans Agency on 0800 085 3600 this will ensure that there is no overpayment of pension, which will need to be repaid at a later date from the deceased's estate.
